Instructions for Patients Having Cataract Surgery

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Pre-operative Instructions:

Eve (Circle One): RIGHT

- 1. *Coumadin / Warfarin Patients:* You will need to have an INR drawn within 24-48 hours prior to your procedure, with a result of under 3.0
- 2. Beginning 3 days prior to your procedure, **DISCONTINUE** use of make-up, mascara, lotion, sunscreen, and/or creams on the face.
- 3. Beginning 3 days prior to your procedure, apply a warm compress (such as Nummies, warm washcloth, etc.) to your eyelids nightly, and allow the compress to sit for at least 5 minutes. Following the warm compress, while keeping your eyes closed, gently cleanse around your eye to include your upper and lower eye lids (recommended with OcuSoft Lid Scrubs or a mild unscented soap). Lastly, follow up with a rinse of warm water. This is required to be repeated NIGHTLY until your operation.
- 4. The **DAY BEFORE** your surgery, eat lightly and avoid all alcohol, cannabis, and other narcotic medications unless it is deemed necessary by your Primary Care Physician.
- 5. <u>Make arrangements to have someone, other than yourself, drive you to and from your procedure</u>. It is required by the surgery center that you have transportation arrangements after surgery, and public transportation <u>may not</u> be substituted. Your ride is required to <u>stay</u> at the surgery center throughout the duration of your visit. In addition, <u>you will need a driver for your one-day post-operative</u> <u>appointment</u> at Southwest Eyecare.

Day of Surgery:

- 1. Nothing to eat or drink 8 hours prior to your check-in time, and this includes candy, gum, cough drops, and mints. <u>Water *only*</u> is okay up to 3 hours prior to your check-in time.
- 2. Take all medications as normal the morning of surgery with a sip of water except **NO injectable diabetes medication** (e.g., Insulin, etc.), unless otherwise instructed.
- 3. Wear **loose**, **comfortable clothing**, preferably something that buttons, clasps, or zips over your torso so that the surgical team can easily place EKG leads on your upper chest and lower belly.
- 4. If you use oxygen, please bring your portable unit with you to the surgery center.
- 5. Bring the cataract post-operative kit, eye drops, instructions, a photo ID, insurance card(s), and applicable copay(s) to surgery.

Instructions for Patients Having Cataract Surgery

<u>REMINDER</u>: You will be called & notified of your surgery **check-in** time the DAY BEFORE surgery.

<u>Post-operative Instructions</u>:

- 1. You will be using eye drops for several weeks after surgery.
 - a. On the day of your procedure, you will use your drops every 2 hours while awake, unless otherwise instructed by the recovery room team.
 - b. Please bring all drops to EVERY post-operative appointment.
 - c. Begin the drop schedule provided to the post-operative appointment the DAY AFTER your procedure.
 - d. If the operating room placed a NON-see-through patch (typically white) over your eye, please do not remove it until the office removes it at your one-day post-operative appointment.
- 2. The following restrictions apply for at least one week after surgery
 - a. No makeup, lotions, and/or creams around the eye.
 - b. Avoid strenuous exercise (running, golf, etc.).
 - c. Avoid lifting, pushing or pulling anything over 15 pounds.
 - d. Avoid excessive bending with your back; bending at the knees is preferable.
 - e. Avoid getting water in the operative eye (swimming, spas, etc.). Showering as normal is okay after 24 hours, but avoid getting soaps and direct water streams in the operative eye.
- 3. After your SWEC appointment the day following your surgery, you may leave the patch off your eye during the day.
 - a. You must wear your "Solar Shields" (sunglasses) when outdoors for 4 weeks and your eye shield (transparent patch) from your post-op kit at bedtime and/or naps for 1 week.
- 4. You will be able to see out of the operative eye during the first 1-2 weeks of healing, but your vision may be blurred throughout this period of adjustment.
- 5. After your eye heals, you may need to wear glasses for your best vision (distance, near, or both).

It is normal to feel some scratchiness and/or irritation during the first few days following surgery; however, *SEVER PAIN OR SUDDEN VISION LOSS IS NOT NORMAL*. Should one or both of these occur, **please call** (505) 346-0500 immediately.
