## EYE CARE ROUTINE PRIOR TO YOUR PRE-OPERATIVE APPOINTMENT

In order to <u>prepare your eyes for your pre – operative testing</u>, please begin the following regimen to BOTH EYES as soon as possible and continue until instructed otherwise:

Preservative Free Artificial Tears - One drop to both eyes 3 - 4 times daily or as directed.

Examples: Freshkote, Refresh Mega-3, Refresh Plus, Retain MGD, Oasis Tears Plus (In office \$21.57 tax included)

Warm Compresses - Use moist heat with massage to the base of the eyelashes nightly

- Moist heat used to open plugged glands, improve blood flow, regain free flowing oils
- Moist Heat Mask (Oasis /Bruder): Available at check out for your convenience (\$16.18 tax included), OTC or online to alleviate the need to re-heat a washcloth; heat 20 seconds in the microwave (Patented Medibeads absorb water molecules from the air and release them as clean moist heat.)

Lid Scrubs - Gently scrub eyelid margins at lash base

- ❖ Gentle pressure applied to clean the base of the lashes with Q − tip, cloth or pad to remove bacteria, debris and other inflammatory material. Use diluted baby shampoo
- Effective tea tree oil products: Oasis Lid and Lash cleansing pads (in office \$32.36 tax included), Blephadex, Mediviz, or Optase can be purchased online. Avenova spray (by prescription only.)

Night time "PM" gel drops - Once nightly before bedtime, OTC product. Humidify air; avoid fans.

- Gently pull down lower lid and squeeze a small amount into both eyes.
  Examples: Refresh gel drops, or Genteal PM or Systane PM
- Use before bed. Will temporarily blur vision so use just before bed; wash residue from lashes in the morning.

**IMPORTANT:** This must be started no later than 2 weeks before your appointment. Do not use make – up or lotion on your face, or eyes the day of your pre-operative appointment as doing so can interfere with your pre-operative measurements.

<u>Contact Lenses</u>: If you wear contact lenses they <u>will need to be out</u> for a certain amount of time prior to your pre-operative appointment and prior to your surgery.

- ❖ Soft Contact Lenses 2 weeks prior to your pre operative appointment for measurements
- ❖ Hard Contact Lenses 6 8 weeks prior to your pre operative appointment for measurements. (Unless otherwise noted by the doctor.)
